

## Namibia marks I-Day, talks on trade, investments, economic and revenue outlook

The 27<sup>th</sup> Independence celebration of Namibia which was hosted by its Honorary Consul, Lynda Kok Shun at the Mauritius Gymkhana Club on March 21 saw a bevy of dignitaries converging for a toast to the honor of the young African nation. It

coincided with the African Economic Platform (AEP) that was attended by Namibian Prime Minister Dr Saraa Kuugongelwa-Amadhila to the island and who attended the Independence Day celebration with her 20 person delegation. It was held in the presence of the President of the Republic Dr Ameenah Gurib Fakim, Mentor Minister Sir Anerood Jugnauth, Tourism Minister Anil Gayan and several other foreign diplomats based in Mauritius were present.

The African country obtained freedom on March 21, 1990 where the event honored the country's fallen heroes and heroines, gallant sons and daughters who fought for their independence. The narrative about armed struggle for the country's independence that started in the mid -1960s led by the South West Africa People's Organization's (SWAPO), where the military wing, the People's Liberation Army of Namibia (PLAN) began attacks on South African forces to the freedom fighters laying their lives for the country to execution, torture, maimed and thousands detained in appalling conditions is quite a reminder of pre-independence days for several countries.

In an exclusive interview with Platform Africa, Her Excellency Prime Minister of Namibia Dr Kuugongelwa-Amadhila highlighted various trade and investment issues that are being looked into, including the one conducted with Mauritius. The year 2016 was not easy for Namibia from an economic perspective on account of several negative factors piling together: The trade volumes with Namibia's main trading partners Angola and South Africa fared poorly both on the international front.

"Namibia's trade volumes with Angola and South Africa suffered a decline in the same fashion as investment activities as a result of the prevailing economic situation. However, we have been able to diversify our sources of investment in export destinations to mitigate our vulnerabilities with our trading partners facing the impact of crisis. As a result of difficulties faced the partner countries, it has reduced the demand for the Namibian products and, therefore, we witnessed a decline both in exports and Forex's earning which reduced our business stream and government revenue, " said the Namibian PM.

Dr Kuugongelwa-Amadhila added, "It's in this context that we have been requesting Mauritius to put up agreements designed to protect and attract investment by avoiding to go the Double Taxation route and explore areas of possible investments. We have worked with the Government here to deepen capacity building and help beef up our respective institutions in areas such as automation of services."

"During my trip, we discussed possible areas of cooperation such as health, education, tourism and energy where I am looking forward for the implementation of the ideas to embolden our cooperation. We cannot only move to Europe and America but need to optimize the regional integration within Africa by promoting trade and investments between African states."

The country is planning to implement a timely and targeted fiscal consolidation with a view to align expenditure in line to the revised economic and revenue outlook to maintain sustainability.

"We have a three-year financial framework where we initially planned to cut down on expenditure but we have now revised it for we want to focus on the most optimal areas that will help boost the finality of our investments. We have also planned to come up with an industrialization policy, to review our procurement system, reform our taxation system in terms of policy and administration to strengthen compliance enforcement with tax laws and help improve revenue collection. We are also hoping that, apart from cost reduction and improving efficiency coupled with effectiveness of expenditure, our foray into the industrialization process would help diversify our economy and reduce our vulnerability on the market," the PM explained.

Namibia's economy has faced a tough environment for which the estimated GDP growth for 2016 was expected to be 2 percent lesser than the earlier estimate of around 4.3 percent. Apart from the cutting of expenditure and realigning them, the government has recently approved a law on public private partnership, to stabilize and reduce the growing debt.

She points out, "The aim is to help the government harness the technical capacity and private sector investment to finance infrastructure and delivery of public

services. We want to structure the Namibian economy in such a manner that the fiscal consolidation does not precipitate a recession because in a small country like ours, the government stands as a very important stakeholder and when it cuts down on expenditure it leads to a delay in infrastructure. It also means a reduction in consumption which can lead to minimizing effect on business activities and employment generation. We think with PPP, there is a huge possibility for growth in the economy. We are also strengthening our investment in human resources development, so that we can support the implementation of the industrialization agenda, for firms that are aiming to come into Namibia will have a skilled labor force to support them. We also have an ambitious innovation and research program, that we are funding through our research council. This, along with our integration plan that we have been discussing at this platform would lead to value chain across our borders in terms of investments and trade, within the African community. The African Economic Platform 2017 has been a very fruitful exposure for us, because it brought together the stakeholders, the government and private sector."

Today, diplomacy must be made on the economic front. In the same vein, Namibia's diplomats must be encouraged to be conversant in the country's trade and investments.

Agreeing to this, Dr Kuugongelwa-Amadhila said, "It should not only be about promoting political and cooperation between countries, but it should promote growth of trade and investments. We have observed that our international relations with other countries must be optimized in order to identify potential areas of trade and investments for their businesses, but in a way, that does not optimize results for the African states. We want our diplomats to understand what the policies of the country are, and be able to identify people who are interested in activities that can promote mutual benefits for themselves and for our country too."
